Doosan Forklift Parts - Doosan Infracore Company Ltd. is an intercontinental company consisting of Diesel Engines, Defense Industry products, Industrial Vehicles, Construction Equipment and Machine Tools and Automation Systems.

Their United States partner, Doosan Infracore America Corporation, stationed in Suwanee, Georgia houses a 170,000 square foot manufacturing facility, home to a Compact Equipment and Construction division. Cleveland, Ohio houses the Lift Truck division, and West Caldwell, New Jersey has a Machine Tool division. The U.S. headquarters in Georgia facilitates a first rate parts operation capable of supplying an excess of 25,000 line items to support Lift Truck, Compact Equipment, Machine Tool and Construction consumer needs.

With a network consisting of over 90 autonomous dealers, the lift truck group supplies quality materials handling equipment to the comprehensive North American market. Doosan Infracore America Forklift sellers successfully operate in over 220 service and sales locations all through Canada and the U.S. The forklift product line remarkably features 63 distinctive machines consisting of 82 various battery and engine configurations of Electric-powered and Internal Combustion lift trucks. Capacities of these numerous vehicle versions vary from 3,000 to 33,000 lbs. All trucks are manufactured in an ISO 9001 qualified facility.

Doosan Infracore America is the fastest rising forklift and lift truck company in the North American market, thanks to its excellent level of product performance and their persistently high level of client support and service given to all Doosan Infracore Forklift clients. The U.S. forklift division based in Cleveland has a expert team knowledgeable in Sales, Purchasing, Marketing, Logistical and Technical Support.

Initially the domestic lift truck marketplace in Korea was an open import enterprise. Korea Machinery Co. Ltd. started in 1960, to import fully assembled lift trucks as part of a home-based machinery expansion venture. Product sales of these goods were primarily targeted to state-run companies, large scale organizations, and the armed forces. This eventually led to a unification with Daewoo Heavy Industries Ltd. In 1976, the Forklift Division begun business operations throughout Korea to service and sell this heavy equipment. By 1978, a forklift production plant was successfully completed. Continuous technical training grew to become the new focus for enhancing quality and product development.

Home-based forklift trade for Daewoo started in 1967 and grew to an astounding 90% market share in Korea. By the 1980's, Daewoo's progressive technological enhancements combined with sales success placed them in a position of significant growth of their lift truck operations.

In 1981, Caterpillar Industrial Inc. of the United States, proposed a joint enterprise project to counter act competitive pressures in the US materials handling market. This endeavor drastically expanded Daewoo's forklift sales. Construction was completed in 1984 to facilitate a contemporary plant which helped set up the business for the fabrication of high added-value goods suitable for export. In 1993, the company had a international sales system and started exporting designs they had developed through in-house technology, as an independent product. Certifications were then acquired from CE of Europe, UL of the United States and ISO 14001 and ISO 9001, securing growth opportunities into international markets.
